#### **Course Offerings**

#### Down and Dirty Rapid Intervention Team (RIT) (7-8 hours)

This one-day RIT training class is designed to give you as many repetitions as possible using the equipment your department has on hand for experiences you are most likely to encounter. After completing this training day, you will feel confident in responding as a Rapid Intervention Team member in your response area.

We will start the day off with small sided training and rapid repetitions. Firefighter down CPR, pack conversions and mayday calls and RIT bag familiarization are the baseline skills needed to perform well in a rapid intervention situation.

Next, we move on to the drill component of the day. Now that we have the skills down, we put them to use in preplanned drills while increasing the intensity. The Pittsburgh, Denver and NEFT drills will put your skills, teamwork, and endurance to the test!

We finish the drill session with the LT. Ferry drill. This is another real-world scenario we train on that was created from a successful rescue of a down firefighter in Manchester NH. This drill encompasses all skills and lasts no more than 5 minutes for each repetition – demonstrating how fast things can go wrong and how quickly we need to act to change outcomes.

Lastly, we will finish off the day with real world scenarios using our unique training props. We will create a house floor plan complete with furniture and furnishings, closets and bedrooms, hallways, doors, and windows. Each situation will be different and require any number of the previous trained on skills to extricate the down firefighter.

This is an intense course covering a wide range of skills in a short amount of time. Please be prepared to work hard! Knee pads and a change of clothes are recommended!

#### **Electric Vehicles (7 hours)**

Like it or not electric / battery powered vehicles are here to stay.

Along with these vehicles come associated problems that confront fire service responders. Using classroom presentations and first-person observations this course will provide firefighters with the fundamentals of safe operations around electric / battery powered vehicles. We will provide hands on training utilizing an electric vehicle accessed on a hydraulic service lift.

#### **Minimum Manpower Operations (7 hours)**

The shortage of physical assets (manpower) is a problem shared by fire departments throughout the country. Our challenge is to operate, efficiently and safely with the assets we have on hand. Through classroom instruction and hands-on practical sessions this course will provide student with the knowledge and practical experience of formulate Minimum Manpower procedures for their departments.

#### **Rural Water Supply Operations (7 hours)**

We all too often take water for granted but when you do not have enough water to do the job of extinguishing a fire it takes on a special significance. Water supply cannot be taken for granted.

Rural Water Supply Operations examines firefighting, water supply problems and both traditional and emerging technologies in addressing water supply issues. The course looks in depth at water tenders (tankers) and their use in rural fire operations. The course examines "tanking" water in the context of a high-risk evolution in rural operations and treats it accordingly using risk identification, threat assessment and risk management techniques.

Large diameter hose operations and pump operations are also examined in the course.

Practical evolutions will permit participants to put skills and techniques into practice.

## Photovoltaic Safety for Firefighters/ Lithium Battery Firefighter Safety and Tactics (7-8 hours)

Solar Photovoltaic (PV) systems are becoming more common on homes and businesses across Vermont. Building mounted PV systems present special considerations for firefighters when handling emergencies within these buildings and around these systems. This 4-hour course will provide the participants with information about what firefighters need to know to safely deal with fires in buildings equipped with PV systems and other emergencies that occur around ground mounted PV equipment.

Topics include an introduction to photovoltaics and electrical theory, recognition of PV systems and components, general PV system operation, common safety labeling, tactical considerations, disconnecting means, fire suppression and ventilation issues, and the hazards associated with fire service operations in the area of a PV system.

Lithium-ion batteries are becoming commonplace on the roads, in industrial settings, and in the residential fire environment, and pose unique challenges to the fire service. This 3-hour course introduces students to how lithium-ion battery systems work, how they fail, and how they burn. It provides students with tactical guidance for safely and effectively dealing with fires in electric vehicles, energy storage systems, e-mobility devices, and other applications of lithium-ion battery technology.
